The President confirmed NPAQ is working closely with DESI on the issue of climate change in terms of management of bush fire, weeds and ferals. Park acquisitions are prioritised and chosen by government in terms of regional ecosystems that area not adequately protected. Sally Driml commented that the Wet Tropics Management Authority has adopted an adaptation plan and NPAQ members would be welcome to comment on it. CEO mentioned the recent funding to pilot the Parks Connect Program in SEQ. If the program proves successful, government may be interested in expanding it to other parts of Queensland. The Mountain Biking and User Pays reports are a month away and the CEO offered to share them with members once finalised. Treasurer's Report provided by Clare Birnie. The CEO presented comments and a summary of the FY23/24 Financial Statements as a substitute for the Treasurer who was an apology. The first surplus in many years Bequests and investment dividends are key contributing factors A tight rein on expenditure has kept expenditure slightly under One third of income from investment dividends Revenue plan provides a sustainable financial model Members expressed their thanks to the CEO/Treasurer for the presentation on NPAQs financials. Members appreciated hearing more about the financials rather than just seeing the financial data. Adoption of audited The President called for a motion to adopt the Annual Report and Audited financial statements & Financial Statements. **Annual Report** Laurelle Lowry moved a motion that the annual report and the audited financial statements be adopted. Seconded by Wendy Bell. Motion carried. A special resolution was proposed to amend the NPAQ Rules and allow a Special resolution minimum of 7 councillors and a maximum of 9.
